# NOTE:- CONDITION OF ARETE FIXED STEEL LADDER.

Looking from top bolt on LHS which connects to slot horizontal section is slack and hole has become elliptical giving  $\frac{1}{4}$ " play. The repeated fitting of the hole against the bolt will eventually cause the bolt to shear. This would cause ladder to swing round dislodging climber from ladder. Chain does not give sufficient self protection. If other bolt shears the ladders then become disconnected and chain would slide off. Suggest chain is fixed to rung below to give added protection.
